We welcome you into our community of followers of Jesus and hope that as you worship with us you will come to know the presence of God and the warmth and hospitality of this community of faith.

First Lutheran Church is a member of the Southern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), a church so deeply rooted in the gospel of God's grace that we are free to give our lives joyfully in witness and service. Founded in 1840, First Lutheran has a rich tradition as a caring and supportive family of faith desiring to embody the love of Jesus Christ.

For **HOLY COMMUNION**, you are encouraged to have elements on hand at home to receive. It is best practice that the elements be:

- 1) something made from grain (bread, crackers, or gluten free alternative) and
- 2) a "fruit of the vine" (grape juice, wine).

They do not have to be fancy. Wonder Bread and Welch's Grape Juice (red or white) are just fine. And you do not need fancy containers. A small plate (church word is "paten") and a glass or cup (church word is "chalice") are just fine.

The point of a sacrament is that God takes ordinary human elements and makes them holy so that we might receive God's grace. So whatever humble offering you have is more than adequate.

In Luther's Small Catechism, he talks about Holy Communion in question and answer format. One of the questions asks how eating and drinking can accomplish such amazing things as forgiveness, life, and salvation. Luther's response: "Eating and drinking certainly do not do it, but rather the words that are recorded: 'given for you' and 'shed for you for the forgiveness of sin.' These words, when accompanied by the physical eating and drinking, are the essential thing in the sacrament, and whoever believes these very words has what they declare and state, namely, 'forgiveness of sin.' Therefore, hearing the Word spoken from our altar at First, you will receive God's promises to you in the bread and wine.


SECOND READING TITUS 2:11-14

Gospel: Luke 2:1-14 [15-20]

The Holy Gospel according to Luke.

### Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup>In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. <sup>2</sup>This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. <sup>3</sup>All went to their own towns to be registered. <sup>4</sup>Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. <sup>5</sup>He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. <sup>6</sup>While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. <sup>7</sup>And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

<sup>8</sup>In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. <sup>9</sup>Then an angel of the Lord stood before them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup>But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: <sup>11</sup>to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. <sup>12</sup>This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." <sup>13</sup>And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, <sup>14</sup>"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

<sup>15</sup>When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." 16So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. <sup>17</sup>When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; <sup>18</sup> and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. <sup>19</sup> But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. <sup>20</sup>The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

For thine is the kingdom,


