Dear Sisters and Brothers at First Lutheran Church,

As you all know, the window in the pastor's office here at First Lutheran, has a view across Wittenberg Avenue to an empty lot. I am told that in prior times, the Crowell Collier Building stood where the empty lot now exists. Since I prefer natural light whenever I am indoors, I keep the curtains drawn, so I see the empty lot whenever I am in my office. It is a pleasant and interesting view, for a downtown area.

After yesterday's congregational meeting about the 2022 church budget, and then church council meeting, I have been thinking about how First Lutheran is moving forward while facing many challenges. This morning when I arrived in my office, I opened the curtains and saw that the sun was shining on the empty lot across the street. So, when I began to write this message, my minds, and heart was drawn to scripture. Specifically, I thought about Luke 12:22-32 and Matthew 6:23-33.

The work facing First Lutheran in the near and not so distant future is difficult, but exciting.

Beyond the budget for 2022, First Lutheran searching for a new pastor. The search is a challenge, but I believe it is also a blessing. I encourage every member of First Lutheran to seek the blessing amid the challenge. The first step in seeking and seeing the blessing is to actively pray for the members of the call committee as they begin their work. We should also pray for patience and with thanksgiving as the Holy Spirit of God prepares and guides a new pastor to serve here at Frist Lutheran. Even though at this time we do not know who that person will be, God does.

Both the Matthew and Luke texts I shared above cause me to reflect upon how I am facing the opportunities, challenges, and blessings of each new day in the life, ministry, and mission of First Lutheran Church. The texts talk about clothing, food, barns, lilies, birds, and ask all followers of Jesus difficult faith questions. In many ways, our faith life is like the empty lot across the street. What once was, is no more. What will come next has not been determined.

As we journey now through Advent let me close with a verse from one of the texts. If you want to know if it is from Matthew or Luke, you will have to look it up.

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom."

We have many opportunities to share this fall and winter.

Christmas Bazaar and Bake Sale – Sunday, December 5

This year we are trying something different. We are asking you to donate baked goods, including Christmas cookies and pies, to sell to the congregation on Sunday, December 5. It's an opportunity to stock up for the holidays. We have received a Thrivent grant to buy supplies. Please let a member of the service committee know if you want us to get non-perishable baking supplies for your recipe.

We will also take cookies to our congregation's shut-in members. We'll have a sign-up sheet if you would like to drop some off.

Separate from the bake sale, we will have several tables of Christmas decorations and housewares available at no charge. Take whatever and as much as you can use. We will accept free will offerings.

All proceeds raised will go toward filling Christmas baskets for the hungry of Clark County. We are partnering with Second Harvest Food Bank and St. Vincent de Paul.

Collection for Oesterlen Family Services

Thank you for the many donations already received for the children using Oesterlen family services. With Thrivent grant money, we have been able to purchase additional items on their wish list. Through Thanksgiving we will continue to collect items in memory of long-time service committee member, Don Pyles, who volunteered at Oesterlen. Oesterlen's Wish List
